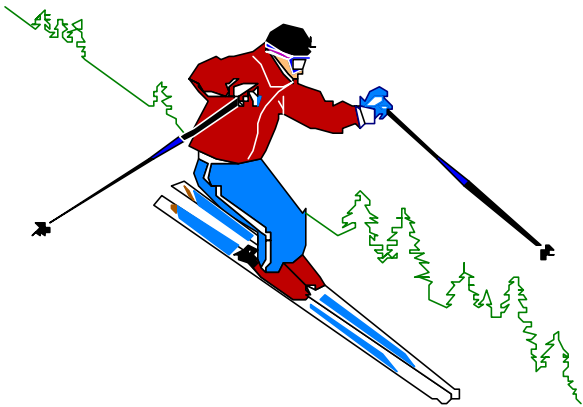
FYI: The Linvill family are long time members of BRSC. They have been active in skiing & sailing along with children & grandchildren who joined us at the pool.

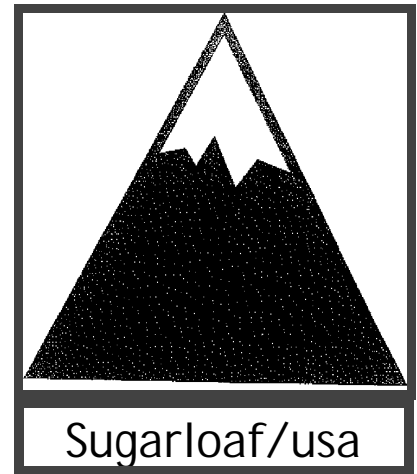
